ABOUT ROTEM AND MOUNIR SAOUMA

Burgundy meets the Rhone. An utter respect for tradition, and in some ways a total break. We've watched as Mounir and Rotem Saouma, of Burgundy producer Lucien Le Moine, slowly developed their estate and wines in Chateauneuf-du-Pape, and the results today are too extraordinary and distinct to ignore.

THE WINE

It makes sense that a producer of great white Burgundy would quickly become enchanted by the possibilities in Pierredon, the heavily limestone-based vineyard in Bedarrides. Only 3% of Châteauneuf is white, and virtually all of it is bottled after six months. Mounir's Châteauneuf is aged 18-24 months and has already been compared to some of the great white Burgundy crus for its depth and minerality.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION

VARIETY: Grenache Blanc, Clairette, Roussanne, Bourboulenc

VINEYARD: Pierredon, with additional plots planted in Courthezon

WINEMAKING: Harvest took place in late September under clear skies; the whites are elegant with great length and nobility, their subtlety and freshness enhanced by careful élèvage.

VINTAGE: 2020 is another excellent vintage for the Rhône Valley. Another dry spring was followed by a moderate summer, this time without the extreme heat spikes of 2019.

AGING: 18-24 months, French oak barrel
